South Coast Branch Presidents Report

It is with pride I present to you our 2015-2016 Annual Report. Our surf lifesaving members have a lot to be proud of, our patrolling members have continued to provide an outstanding level of patrol and rescue services to the community in the South Coast Branch. As evidenced in the report of the Director of Lifesaving the statistics recorded show that our lifesaving members are performing to a high level and have a strong commitment to the safety of the community who visit our breaches.

Our club administrators contribute a highly valued level of commitment to the operations, administration, support, fundraising and financial service to the purpose of their clubs. At all levels of the club network if it were not for the volunteers who step up and take on the variety of job roles that a club and branch require we would be in a poor functional and administrative state, I congratulate all for their continuing efforts.

The Branch Community and School Education program was delivered during the months of September to January. The school Education component saw some 2,100 students participate in the delivery of the program by our team of Sue Whitford and Adam Woodward who covered the southern Illawarra, South Coast, Southern Highlands and Braidwood District during the term four of the school year, including during the school holidays at Christmas/New Year.

During the peak summer holiday period of December,

January our team along with Dr. Rob Brander of the UNSW delivered our water safety program along with Robs “Science of the Surf” talks to many visiting tourists with the series commencing at Shellharbour Surf Lifesaving Club, then Mollymook Surf Lifesaving Club and to Bawley Point / Kioloa. Dr Brander delivered one of his lectures on the beach at Bawley Point following the Bawley Ironman Carnival. Great interest was shown by the gathered audience to Robs lecture and display of purple crystals released into the sea front showing where a RIP runs.

The delivery of the School and Community Education Program would not have been achievable without the support of BlueScope WIN Community Partners and the Veolia Mulwaree Trust. Every school student and adult received a Surf Awareness & Beach Safety Booklet.

On the 27th December, 2015 I was contacted by Rangers of Shoalhaven City Council following numerous sightings of many sharks off Hyams Beach during the peak holiday period. This is not unusual for this location and is a frequent occurrence to those who know the area. Hyams Beach village a community of no more than 200 permanent residents saw an unusually high influx of tourists in the area due to the promotion of the small community in NSW Tourism promotions.

This ultimately saw many thousands of tourists visit the idyllic village on the southern shores of Jervis Bay





during the peak Christmas / New Year period. So many visitors were attending due to the good weather that Shoalhaven City Council had to roster two Rangers to the village and at various times a contra flow traffic arrangement had to be conducted due to heavy traffic and large volumes of visitors to the Hyams Beach.

The Council Rangers following many reports of sharks close inshore then for the following three consecutive days conducted beach patrols. Rangers reported large packs of sharks swimming within 3 metres of swimmers in the calm waters of Hyams Beach. South Coast Branch then arranged the callout on three occasions of the Westpac Lifesaver 3 helicopter from Moruya which attended and patrolled the area.

Following discussions with the Chief Ranger who was making every effort to control the movement of large numbers of vehicles and people, and with an additional ranger on the beach warning of the danger



to swimmers I made a request to Shoalhaven Council to provide a lifeguard coverage for a period of two weeks of the January peak holiday period. Contact was made with the Shoalhaven City Mayor Joanna Gash who herself at the time was on holiday with family in Tasmania.

The Mayor acted immediately and contacted the Council General Manager Mr Russ Pigg and following discussions a sound decision was made to appoint two lifeguards to Hyams Beach. With Lifeguards on Duty from the 1st of January, this first day saw over 1,500 people on Hyams Beach with magnificent warm weather, the evacuation of swimmers due to large shark packs was a daily occurrence over the two weeks of the service.

The Branch saw a number of significant sport events held during the season, Shellharbour SLSC hosted the Australian Surf Rowers Leagues Open Championships,

Branch Championships and a carnival of the Sydney Water Series and will again host the ASRL Open Championships in 2016/17 season. Mollymook SLSC hosted the NSW IRB Championships and the SLSA National IRB Championships. Ocean Swim events have become an increasing event within our clubs calendar with the Shellharbour Ocean Swim, Gerringong Captain Christie Ocean Swim, Nowra-Culburra's Tilbury Ocean Swim and Mollymook Ocean swim which have become increasingly popular events and a good fundraiser for the surf lifesaving clubs. My congratulations to all the clubs and their volunteer work force in hosting and setting up for these outstanding events.

At the commencement of the 2015/2016 season Branch held a Clubs Conference at the Watersleigh Youth works Outdoors Conference Centre, on the upper Shoalhaven River during August 2015. This was an outstanding event for our club officials to attend. Branch invited a number of guest speakers; among the speakers was Superintendent Joe Cassar the NSW Police Shoalhaven Local Area Commander. Joe spoke on the Emergency Management arrangements and where surf lifesaving fits in with assistance to police and water based search and rescue. Ms Pip Butt CPA, NSW SLS Board Member and State Director Finance, Pip spoke on Financial Governance and Reporting and Ms Claire Maddon, a social researcher who gave a very interesting motivational talk on current and future generations. The club officials who attended the conference acknowledged they received a benefit from attending.

The South Coast Branch Awards evening was attended by 124 club members and guests. A great evening and the success and achievements of a number of our members were recognised. Of note was our South Coast Branch Surf Life Saver of the Year, Naida Guy of Kiama Downs SLSC.

Naida is a proud and outstanding surf lifesaver; Naida has been involved from a nipper up to senior membership in surf lifesaving over a period of 25 years. Naida and husband Skip are very actively involved with Kiama Downs and have their young children in nippers. Naida's involvement in her club extends from organising nippers, an age manager, training, a patrol member and a member of the female IRB Racing Team.

Naida is an ambassador for surf lifesaving and displays all the values of surf lifesaving. Naida gives outstanding commitment and service, Naida supports the members of her club, as a peer support person and mentor to younger patrol members, she is inspirational. Naida is also a member of the Kiama Downs Female IRB Racing Team who has many outstanding achievements during the season, including winning the State IRB Racing Championship.

This years Audited Financial Statement shows branch is in a healthy financial position at the end of our fiscal year ending 31 May, 2016. The start of the season was very different though. The expenditure of branch funds in the first three quarters of the season was monitored carefully. This was due a delay in payments to Branch and Clubs across NSW for the distribution of State based fundraising allocations, \$4\$ gear grants, and other allocations received through SLSNSW.

A delay in grants from the NSW Government was also caused due to the transfer for funding responsibility for surf lifesaving from the Department of Sport and Recreation to the Department of Emergency Services. The various payments to branch were not received until the end of the season, thus showing a significant surplus in funds for the end of the fiscal year.

Our Branch Office Building Fund is invested in a Term Deposit and we continue to develop our plans for our own office, training rooms and storage facility. This will eventually alleviate the home office arrangement that each director has in storage of records and equipment of the branch in our homes.

I extend to all our members, juniors, associate, lifesaving and club administrators my appreciation and thanks for their commitment to this great organisation and for their community service. I also acknowledge the work of your Branch Board of Directors, Patrice Joynson, Glenn Matthews, Dana Richards and Jim Connolly for the strident hard work and efforts in managing the branch and delivering outstanding service to our members.

Director of Surf Sports Report 2015 - 16 Season

2015-16 was a good season for our members of South Coast Branch, and the nine clubs. The Sydney Water Series was held in conjunction with the Illawarra Branch and this series is a continued success. I would like to thank Warilla Barrack Point and Shellharbour Surf Life Saving Clubs for hosting 2 out of the 4 rounds of this series. Numerous athletes from our branch performed well against Sydney based clubs.

This event is continuing to be a premiership series along the East coast of Australia attracting high quality athletes and now also involving the Surf Ironman/woman Qualifying Series (SIQS). This coming season will attract this series back in conjunction with our Sydney Water Series and it will be hosted within our branch and potentially televised on FOX sports.

Our Interbranch Team travelled to Cape Hawke - Forster in December of 2015. The change of format for competition worked well for our Athletes and it was a great weekend of action that kept the competition close for viewing for all who travelled to watch.

Our Team was well represented and all athletes performed well across all avenues of surf sports. Thank you to our Branch Management Team, your support during this weekend was appreciated, and a lot of positive feedback was filtered through the Branch.

A different approach for Interbranch selection is being followed for this coming 2016/17 season, more training days will be held to establish our team earlier in the season, and the team also be announced earlier than in previous seasons. All details are on our Branch website in relation to this new process.

Kiama Downs held a development Twilight carnival and this was a success, I think the club learnt from this experience and hopefully they will build and commit to another carnival in the coming 16/17 season. It would be great if another branch club could host a team day or interclub day, to build the branch and develop the young lifesavers who are coming through our ranks, it has been shown that by keeping carnivals social and short that everyone involved walks away with good experiences.

Our annual Branch Championships were held at Shellharbour Surf Club. This year the Championships were held as a one day carnival for the first time, we had perfect conditions for the carnival. The number of Junior and senior participant's on the day were up from the previous season.

The only negative to come out of this one day carnival was that out of 157 events that were run through the course of the day, seven events were not conducted. These were Junior events only, and from the post Branch Championships report conducted, it was found that the carnival didn't start on time due to lack of officials and parent helpers. This is an area we can work on as a Branch. It is planned to run the Branch carnival again as a one day carnival, with dates already in planning and populated on our Branch website.

To the members who did contribute to the running of this successful day, thank you, your efforts are always appreciated.

Country Championships was held at South West Rocks in the first weekend of February. The numbers for the South Coast athletes were down this year, due to the timing of this carnival. This has been noted and mentioned at a SLSNSW level, but as they are trialling still it will head back to South West Rocks again this coming 2016/17 Season, again being held in the first weekend of February.

Warilla Bowls Surf Boat Series was run again with great success and great numbers of South Coast Branch clubs boat crews, old and young, male and female crews participated. Some members coming out of retirement to compete again and some new blood being introduced to the sport of Surf boat racing.

Shellharbour Surf Life Saving Club hosted a very successful ASRL carnival in December and conditions were favourable. Shellharbour Surf Club committee and community pulled together to organise this carnival again with boats travelling from around Australia to compete.

Many clubs took teams to both the State and Australian Titles, once again producing some outstanding results from our Age group competitors with our Cadet and Open Athletes and our Masters athletes who are still performing well at these levels. We are continuing to develop our athletes well through our branch development programs and also through the club development programs with quality coaching and knowledge.

This season Kiama Downs continued their domination in the NSW IRB Premiership series. Congratulations to Kiama Downs for this continued success. Congratulations to all athletes who participated made semi-final or final, or medalled at all levels of competition. Your hard work was rewarded and I congratulate you as an individual but also your club, coaches and parents who also got you there.

I appreciate the support that I have received from the South Coast Branch and Surf Sports Committee in the 2015-16 season, and look forward to our 2016-17 season.

South Coast Branch Director of Lifesaving report 2015-2016

The Surf Lifesaving 2015 / 2016 season wrapped up on Monday 25th of April with patrols finishing across the state and branch. During the season within South Coast Branch our patrolling members performed 189 rescues, 2293 preventative actions, 360 first aid actions and completed 35 373 patrol hours. Throughout the season our nine surf clubs provided these actions to over 154 000 people that visited our beaches.

The statistics above show several changes from the 2014-2015 season in all categories and reflect the activities of nine surf clubs within the branch. The number of rescues performed increased from 151 to 189, the number of preventative actions decreased from 3107 to 2293, the number of first aid actions decreased from 435 to 360 and our clubs completed 35 373 patrolling hours - up from 34 340 hours,

Sussex Inlet SLSC was placed into recess and administration for the season 2014-2015 due to a lack of patrolling members. Under the guidance of Jeremy & Tamara Murdoch and family, Jim Connolly - the Branch Director of Education and a small band of returning and new members who had been training over the winter months (with the assistance of trainers from the Board of Lifesaving and in particular trainers from Nowra-Culburra and Mollmook surf clubs) Sussex Inlet returned to patrolling the beach during the peak 2015/16 December / January holiday season.

A number of new members are currently in training and will shortly be undertaking their assessment for their Surf Rescue Certificate and Bronze Medallion awards. It is hoped that with this nucleus of new members and the further return of past members, Sussex Inlet Surf Club will continue to patrol in the coming season.

As I write this report, South Coast Branch has just held our annual awards night and it was with great pleasure that I was able to present the Surf Lifesaving awards for the past season and to reflect on our achievements over the past 12 months. Without the dedication and commitment of our volunteers on the beach, our beach going public would not enjoy the safety and care that the red and yellow has come to symbolise.

The dedicated members of the Board of Lifesaving, as well as performing their own club duties, have committed themselves to implementing the many compliance requirements that are now part of our organisation. These members of the board carried out the annual gear inspection for all nine clubs, performed patrol audits, assisted clubs with the annual proficiency assessments and through our education section, provided training and assessments across the branch. The board meets monthly (second Tuesday 7:30pm) at Shoalhaven Heads and anyone wishing to share their skills and knowledge and to influence and implement Surf Lifesaving practice is quite welcome to attend.

Lifesaving Agreements

This season saw the finalisation of lifesaving agreements that took us through the past three seasons. These agreements reflect the days and hours that our clubs will patrol and involve input from Surf Lifesaving NSW, the Director of Lifesaving, and the individual club. LSA's are now an integral role in planning our patrol season and involves detailed planning to ensure that all other stakeholders are aware of our role and commitment. Requirements from all levels of Government, SLSNSW, SurfCom and our Emergency Response System as well as the public are part of the planning process.

As this report is being prepared, clubs have been discussing their patrol capabilities and preparing their patrol agreements in line with community and government expectations. These agreements will be finalised in the next few weeks and planning for the patrol seasons 2016/2017, 2017/2018 and 2018/2019 will commence.

Coastal Radio Network

Prior to the 2013 / 2014 season, the number of SurfCom locations was consolidated into two (2) locations and operated over weekends and public holidays. Monday to Friday, State wide coverage came from the Surf Lifesaving State Operations Centre. These changes resulted from the Coastal Radio Network Review. The review recommended a centralised approach to SurfCom for patrol operations and emergency incidents. During the 2015/2016 season, South Coast branch communicated with Surfcom at Warringham.

In May 2014 a further review was conducted into the operation of the CRN over the previous season. Some initial problems became evident, however as the season progressed and radio operators and patrol members became aware of communication protocols and incident reporting, the CRN became a valuable tool in our lifesaving service. Continued enhancements were made during the 2015 / 2016 season. The digital mobile radio network is gaining momentum and was successfully trialled in the Mid North Coast branch. Illawarra Branch will this year go digital and the roll out across the branches will continue as finances become available, DMR will have a financial impact



on our clubs as we upgrade to this new technology, however support is available through our funding arrangements with sponsors and through the support we receive in our annual Lifesaving Equipment grant and the newly established Beach Safety Equipment Fund (a Federal Government initiative established in 2014 that will see all compliant clubs receive \$5,000.00 yearly over the next five years. Clubs within the branch have purchased DMR's through the various funding arrangements that have become available - SC Branch is progressing well with the new digital standard and will be well positioned when the full digital radio network becomes live.

Other changes and enhancements throughout the season have included recording and back up of transmissions through SurfCom, installation of a new repeater on Bannisters Point (Mollmook) and the operation of SurfCom at the State Operations Centre seven (7) days a week during daylight hours.

Another major change to our radio network has been the appointment of approved service providers that can provide a competitive service agreement and a transparent pricing structure. All clubs are now required on an annual basis to have their radios serviced by an approved service agent and re-programmed as required.

The standardisation of Radio Service Agents has decreased the number of radio faults/ issues. Discussion has been held regarding the servicing of new and existing radios, new radios do not require annual servicing within their first 12 months of use.



Rescue of the Month

This award aims to recognise excellence in lifesaving and service delivery, measured against industry best practice and operating procedures. Many exceptional rescues and first aids are performed over and above normal duties showcasing excellence in lifesaving skills and procedures that often go unrecognised. Monthly winners become finalists for the SLSNSW Rescue of the Year. Last season saw this recognition award enhanced - State finalists are now nominated for the National Rescue of the Month award

It was a little disappointing that no nominations by South Coast Branch were submitted this season for the Rescue of the Month. With members in the branch completing over 150 rescues each year, we need to recognise our members for their exceptional work. Let us all look at the amazing work our members undertake and aim for one nomination each month.

Emergency Response System

During the past season a number incidents were recorded that required a response to an incident that was received by the State Operations Centre. The Branch Duty Officers called on patrol teams during patrol hours and after hours response came from club call out teams.

These Duty Officers work effectively with other responders such as Police, Ambulance, Marine Rescue and other Surf Lifesaving assets to effectively co-ordinate the response and to liaise with the other rescue agencies that may be involved.

While many of these incidents had a successful outcome it is saddening to report that we have had three coastal drowning incidents within the Branch.

Tragedies of this magnitude affect all members of the responding call out members and first responders. I would particularly like to highlight the tragedy of Chris Tyler who drowned at Lake Conjola Beach in December 2015. Chris was on holidays with his family from Burnaby, British Columbia, Canada. Chris got caught in a rip and his sister-in-law's husband tried to help. Attempts to resuscitate him on the beach and administration of advanced emergency first aid was unsuccessful.

Members of Mollymook SLSC responded to the incident but tragically, Chris was pronounced dead. Chris, who was aged 35 leaves behind his partner Winnie and his six month old daughter Arianna.

Following the number of drowning (and near drowning) tragedies and the media response and community reaction in the 2014/2015 season, several meetings were held with Shoalhaven City Council in an attempt to prevent further deaths within our area.

Signs that are in line with the National Aquatic Recreation Signage Style Manual have now been installed at Burrill Beach and Dolphin Point by Shoalhaven City Council and at other locations in the Shoalhaven area that are in the vicinity of Holiday

Haven Caravan and Camping areas. It is hoped that increased funding for lifesaving services will become available and that improved signage warning of beach hazards in hotspot areas will continue to be implemented.

Australian Coastsafe have completed their Coastal Public Safety Risk Assessment within all NSW local government areas. This project was funded by the NSW Ministry for Police and Emergency Services under the NSW Water Safety Black Spots fund and will provide a 'Blueprint' for NSW from which an effective drowning prevention strategy can be developed to meet the National and State goal to reduce drowning deaths by 50% by 2020.

In my report this year I am including some extracts from the report - "The Value of Surf Lifesaving to the Community". As we are part of a much larger organisation it is important our members feel valued and our efforts do not go unnoticed,

The Value of Surf Lifesaving to the Community

Surf Life Saving New South Wales (SLSNSW) is the peak water safety, drowning prevention and rescue organisation in New South Wales (NSW) with over 100 years of history. SLSNSW is a not-for-profit organisation which relies on Government funding, community generosity including donations/ fundraising and corporate sponsorship to support the work of our volunteers.

Our primary role is to save lives on the beach and our 129 Surf Life Saving Clubs (SLSC's) and 77 000 members in NSW, make us one of the largest volunteer movements in Australia. We exist to provide a safe beach and aquatic environment throughout NSW. Since recording began in 1949, surf lifesavers in NSW have saved more than 360 000 lives. SLSNSW makes an invaluable contribution to the community by providing a safe and enjoyable experience for visitors to our beaches.

Input approach

The input approach to valuing the contribution of SLS identifies the costs of providing SLS services, including:

- The value of volunteer time
- The amount spent by volunteers on out-of-pocket expenses relating to SLS
- The expenditure by SLSNSW and its entities.

In 2014/15 our volunteer lifesavers patrolled a total of 672,967 hours on NSW beaches and outside of patrol hours a further 188 630 volunteer hours were spent by our volunteers officiating at major state carnivals, coaching, volunteering as age managers, training and assessing and the like. When these are combined, it equates to 861 597 volunteer hours and the input value of this volunteer labour is calculated at \$34 million.

The out-of-pocket expenses by volunteers are estimated to cost \$4.4 million and the total expenditure of SLS entities is \$37 million.

Essentially the input approach focuses on the time that surf lifesavers provide as volunteers, their out-

of-pocket expenses and the resources used by surf lifesavers and their clubs in providing lifesaving services to the community. In total, the estimated input value of SLS is \$75.2 million. This however, only focuses on a small aspect of estimated economic effects and by focusing purely on the costs; it understates the true value of SLS's services.

Output approach

The output approach to valuing the contribution of SLS identifies the value of lives saved and injuries avoided as a result of SLS activities. Volunteer lifesaving services in NSW provides the greatest value in avoiding costs associated with drowning deaths and the value of lives saved and assisted. The estimated value of SLS in preventing:

- Drowning deaths is \$1.35 billion
- Permanent incapacitation is \$565 million
- Minor injuries is \$44,000

Estimated value of Surf Life Saving in NSW

Comparing the output value with the input value provides a benefit-cost ratio. That is, for every dollar spent on SLS, what is the value of lives and injuries avoided? The benefit-cost ratio for the services of SLSNSW volunteers is 46 to 1. This means that for every dollar invested in SLS in NSW, there is a return of \$46.

If lifesaving patrol services were no longer undertaken by volunteers and their labour was paid for by a Government agency or service provider (and the wage is included as a cost), the benefit-cost ratio is 26 to 1.

In both cases, the benefit-cost ratio is significantly positive and demonstrates considerable net benefits directly achieved for the community from SLS activities undertaken in NSW.

In the absence of Surf Life Saving activities.

It is estimated that in the absence of SLS services provided through volunteer lifesavers during 2014/15 there would be:

- 320 additional drowning deaths (excluding rescues that result from a preventative action)
- 234 additional permanent incapacitations (including rescues that result from a preventative action)
- 1,091 additional minor injuries or first aid treatments



Patrol Audit 2015 / 2016

Over the course of the season, Board of Lifesaving District Supervisors conducted patrol audits in accordance with the SLSNSW Patrol Audit checklist. Patrols are scored over four categories:

- 1) Personnel (includes lifesavers on duty, qualifications and awards and patrol uniform).
- 2) Beach Management (includes water surveillance, gear and equipment layout and location, log books and procedures guidelines and first aid room standards).
- 3) Gear and Equipment (includes minimum gear requirements, beach vehicles, first aid kits, oxygen resuscitation kits, defibrillators and spinal equipment)
- 4) Practical Assessment (scenario)

At the end of the season the Patrol Audit was won by Shellharbour SLSC and Mollymook SLSC - both with perfect scores of 300 points

With such a close finish, this competition can be decided by less than ‘one patrol cap’ being worn, to all clubs a great effort and your participation can only enhance our lifesaving standards and the service we provide to the public.

Gear and Equipment Audit 2015/ 2016

Hotly contested every season is the annual gear and equipment audit. All clubs must meet minimum standards in the equipment that is required for safely and effectively patrolling our beaches and for providing First Aid as well as communications along our beaches and with SurfCom.

Over the course of two days and several hundred kilometres of travel our dedicated team of auditors visit every surf club within the branch and inspect and count and check for compliance, every item that is required to patrol our beach to a minimum standard in line with the gear and equipment list that is recorded on Surfguard and requirements by SLSNSW.

This year the results were:
First - Mollymook SLSC
Second - Kiama Downs

Season 2016 / 2017

The coming season will be here sooner than we think or want! SLSA and SLSNSW have strategic plans and it is important that we work together to implement these plans. We will continue to see the results of the many reviews that have been conducted prior to the start of the season.

Reviews will be held on the Surf Emergency Response System, Support Operations, Standard Operating Procedures, Gear Inspections and Patrol Audits.

Improvements and enhancements in technology will see our members patrolling smarter and with changes in patrol types being implemented this season, our beaches will continue to become safer for the public. Surfguard is continually being enhanced and is a valuable tool in preparation and planning of your clubs lifesaving and education requirements.

As the season approaches, club committees in conjunction with their lifesaving committees need to

start planning now. Does your club have a strategic plan? Has the lifesaving committee evaluated last years patrols and recommended changes to the way you patrol your beach?

In my report last year, I posed the following question. An integral member of the lifesaving committee is the Club Captain (Director of Lifesaving) - does your club have the right person with a passion for the job in this role? This question is still relevant today and for the future health of our clubs, it is a big role but with the support of the club committee and the technology resources available it can be a satisfying and rewarding role.

Education is an important part of our organisation, has your club identified any training needs and requirements that will enhance our members patrolling experience? This year saw changes in our skills maintenance checks (proficiencies) and this year we will see changes in resuscitation, patient management in the event of fainting and wound management and changes to spinal incident management.

These changes are in line from guidelines developed by the Australian Resuscitation Council and it will be up to the club trainers and assessors to upskill and retrain our members. Keep in touch with your Club Education Officer who will guide you through these changes.

Recognition of our members is vital to retaining and enthusing our members - do you nominate and award your members for long service and patrol awards? The Rescue of the Month program is a successful program that now has national recognition and allows us to showcase the skills of our members in major first aid and rescue incidents. I challenge all clubs to nominate for this award and would like to see South Coast Branch submit a nomination every month. The past season saw 189 rescues carried out within the branch yet no Rescue of the Month awards were nominated to the Board of Lifesaving for consideration. Even if unsuccessful at State level, the Branch nomination receives a citation and a pair of binoculars.

Our pre-season briefing will be held prior to the start of the patrol season and I look forward to welcoming all Club Captains, Chief Training Officers and Patrol Captains to this important meeting. A summary of the past season will be presented but more importantly, a forum to present the changes for the 2016 / 2017 season will be provided.

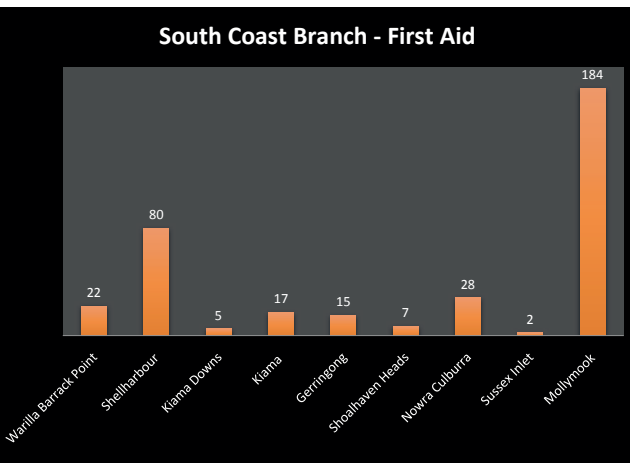
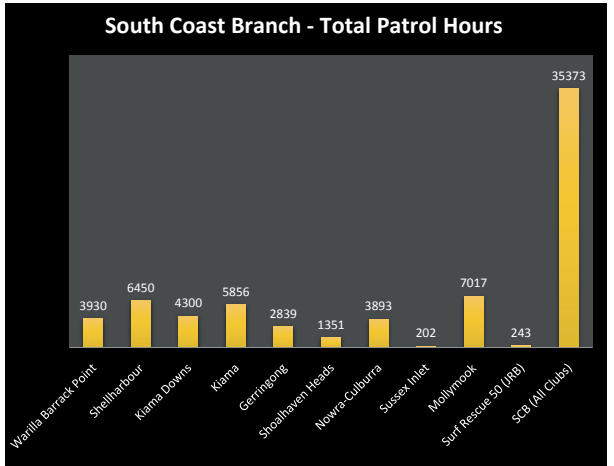
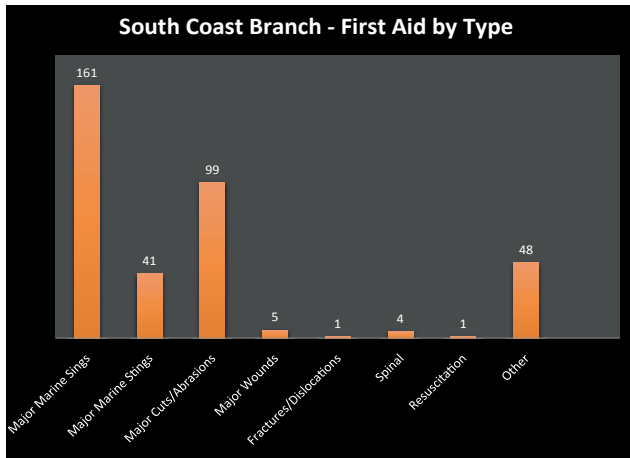
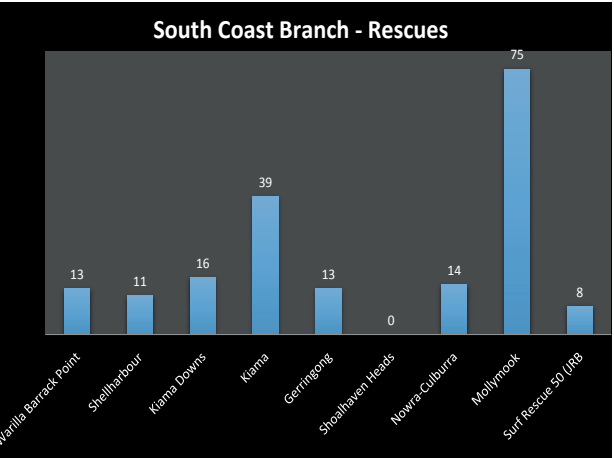
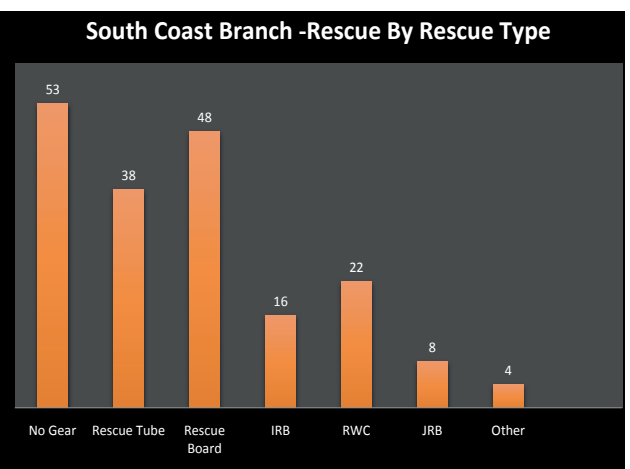
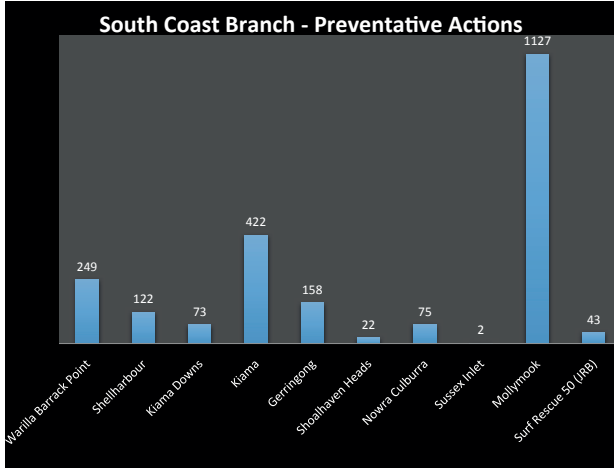
Representatives from SLSNSW will be in attendance to introduce the changes to training and skills maintenance and keep us up to date with the latest techniques in first aid and patient management.

Director of Education Report 2015 - 2016 Season

The South Coast Branch training calendar started in the pre-season with a number of specialist courses which were requirements for patrolling members in all clubs. The attendance was good and the success rate high. Many of these courses were run by new facilitators.

With the number of facilitators increased, these courses were also run during the season, many at the request of single clubs. This is something the Branch had found difficulty with in previous seasons.

Good numbers of candidates presented from nearly all clubs for the basic awards of Surf Rescue Certificate and Bronze Medallion/Certificate II in Public Safety (Aquatic Rescue) and were successful in gaining these awards. Many of these candidates then trained for the more specialised awards and were successful.

Again, for this season, the numbers of officials able to train, assess or facilitate awards has increased, which is of benefit to all clubs.

At the pre-season briefing, barriers to consistency in assessment was raised as a topic. The concerns expressed by TAF's in this area lead to a full Board of Lifesaving meeting being devoted to this topic, principally in resuscitation. Feedback indicates that this was well received by TAF's.

Additionally, each Facilitator and club Chief Training office received at the beginning of the season, a thumb drive containing all required forms associated

with education and assessment of all awards. This packaged up paperwork which would have been in several places on the web. Again, feedback indicated that these thumb drives were useful and well received.

The re-endorsement of all TAF's this season was changed to electronic application by TAF's, approval by Branch and processed by SLSNSW. With some initial hiccups, the new process worked and will become the standard process in future seasons.

The numbers of IRB awards gained by club members continues to be relatively low for patrol requirements. While Branch TAF's have always been prepared to assist in training and assessment in this area, clubs need to find suitable members and put them forward.

My appreciation is extended to all TAF's for their work during this busy season. Additional appreciation is extended to the Education Panel members, Brett Lark, Dave Gorman, Trina Jensen, Josh Douglas and Ando Austin.

Training

Ongoing recruitment and training remains an essential component of the Clubs rejuvenation. Many thanks to the clubs of the South Coast Branch, who have assisted in training our Club members, whether at Sussex or beyond. Members have participated in Bronze Medallion, ARTC, Silver Medallion (BBM), Spinal and First Aid training over the past year. Training has been taking place nearly every Sunday

since the season end, building capacity for next season, particularly in the number of Bronze Medallion holders available for active patrol duty.

Nippers

Surf Lifesaving NSW still prevents the Club from conducting a Junior Activities program. With a growing membership and active patrol, we are hopeful that Nippers will return to Sussex Inlet next year. The Nipper program is so important, not only for the active and educational role it provides young people, but also the significant recruitment potential it offers as parents and carers involve themselves in Club life.

Fundraising

Thanks to Brian Forde, the Club canteen has been refurbished, and is able to provide snacks and meals to members and beach-goers.

Ongoing gratitude is owed to Steve Jones, and the South Coast Branch for their advice, assistance and financial support. Many thanks also to the Shoalhaven City Council, Holiday Haven Tourist Parks and the Commonwealth Department of Social Services for their financial contributions to the vital volunteer services provided by the Club.

Shoalhaven Heads Surf Life Saving Club President Report



Again this season our patrolling membership grew, however it grew by less than the club needs. Member recruitment and retention are going to be a challenge for the club overall and its new committee for the coming season. The club needs to attract a minimum of 10 bronze patrolling members this season, mainly to minimise the patrolling obligation on existing members. The club through its own efforts will be looking to Branch and SLSNSW for support and resources to assist in this goal.

This season as in past seasons Shoalhaven City Council provide lifeguard services in lieu of our club run Saturday patrols, this was successful in alleviating some of the obligations our volunteer lifeguards provide particularly over the busy Christmas holiday period.

We would like to thank the South Coast Branch and Shoalhaven City Council with lifeguard support over the Christmas period, this support ensured our beach was patrolled.

The committee and the club are working hard to ensure membership increases are the number one priority. As always the club is always looking for members to assist in the running of the organization. The committee meets on the second Tuesday of the month in the club rooms, we always welcome new members.

On a patrolling front our beach remained fatality free. In fact, the beach this season was rescue free, this is testament to member training. We provided a total in excess of 1,300 volunteer hours on the beach, that does not include water safety at external events, surf carnivals or nipper water safety.

Again this season we increased our nipper aged membership. With the increase in nipper numbers we therefore had an increase in junior members attending local carnivals. This season saw our club represented at all local carnivals, Branch Carnivals. With some encouraging results achieved.

Local Councils and SLSNSW need to look at this issue confronting regional surf clubs and provide resources such as paid lifeguards or assistance from bigger metropolitan clubs. Without investigation and without assistance small regional clubs will continue to struggle along and their patrolling commitments will be compromised.

We had a good year with training with a number of new Bronze members being inducted as well as a large number of IRBD and IRBC certificates being awarded. Thanks must go to all trainers for their time and effort.

In November 2016 the Shoalhaven Heads Surf Life Saving Club will be celebrating its 50th anniversary. A weekend of activities has been planned, with the centerpiece being a black-tie dinner being held at the surf club on the 26th November. A full list of the planned events will be available in the club's website and notice boards throughout the season.

This season will be a great opportunity for the club, the local community and members past and present to celebrate the club's achievement and to look forward to what the next 50 years of lifesaving in the Shoalhaven will bring.

The club has had some cosmetic improvements completed over the last 12 months, these will continue for the first part of the season. The clubhouse has been painted internally and externally. A thank you must go to Dulux for providing a significant amount of the required paint and to the South Coast Correctional Centre community projects, who have provided the labor to complete the job. I would like to thank all our patrolling members for an outstanding job they have done again this year, many of you back up year after year. Also a thank you to the committee who invest a huge amount of personal time to ensure the club runs smoothly.

Warilla Barrack Point SLSC Presidents Report 2015 - 2016

Warilla Barrack Point Surf Lifesaving Club has just completed our 55th season of patrols at Warilla Beach. This season was the last of our 3 year agreement with Shellharbour City Council, Surf Life Saving South Coast Branch and Surf Lifesaving NSW. Now at the start of the 2016/17 season we will be looking at renegotiating our next 3 year patrol service level agreement.

This past season saw a challenge that was unexpected. Into the early part of our patrolling season we were advised that one of our patrols, the whole patrol in fact, had decided to withdraw from doing voluntary surf patrols. This did create problems, our patrol rosters had been sent to members and on the web. We had to call on volunteers who were already doing patrols to cover the extra hours. As the season progressed two more of our patrols lost members and we finished up deleting these patrols.

To cover the gaps we asked our patrols to do extra hours to cover the short fall. Talking to the members as to why they were not doing patrols, some said it was due to work, change in life style, do not want to train any more, children do not want to go any more, Surf Club is to full on. This is our challenge for next season to rebuild our membership.

Our Club provided over 3,200 voluntary hours patrolling Warilla Beach. If we break the hours down each of our patrolling members average 42 hours of voluntary service to our community. Our objective is to provide a safe beach environment for both the public and our members. In this area our members have excelled in their vigilance and service. We can still report that no lives were lost at Warilla Beach during patrol hours.

I would to thank Shellharbour City Council for their continued support for our Club, also a thank you to Mitch Copas and his team of professional Lifeguards. The relationship between council lifeguards and lifesavers is a strong one.

Our Club is fortunate to have Peter Condran as our Club Captain. Pete is a tireless worker for the Club. As mention earlier Pete with the assistance of the executive had a lot of work to do with rearranging our patrols. Pete had some time off due to ill health but is right back into full swing. Peter was assisted by Nathan Perretta our Rescue Services Coordinator who is there to assist our patrolling members, also to the Patrol Captains who managed to obtain a high standard of participation from their respective patrols.

Over 35 of our members have achieved 100% patrol attendance.

Our Junior Activities Committee started the season without a Chairperson, but still managed to conduct point scores, nipper education and have regular training days for all competitors. It was a great sight to see senior and junior competitors training together on Thursday afternoons. The junior committee had many hands to make light work - well done. On a

positive note the JAC have met and already have a Chairperson and committee on the go for next season. Membership of the Nippers was around the same as last year.

One aspect that is gaining in strength is our award training led by Cy Goodair with Thierry Pelaez & mentoring by Dave Hough. This team put through over 33 candidates who were successful in gaining their surf lifesaving awards. As we know the Education Officer's role is an important function in ensuring members are trained to the highest level, thus ensuring the success of our club for effective patrolling members, so we say thanks to Cy and Thierry.

On the building front the work has been slow; now that the season has ended we are looking at increasing the work load. Jamie and Mick are leading our team of renovators and they will be knocking on your door soon for help. We are still looking for financial assistance, any assistance is most welcome. Steve Krinks & James Allen are out chasing grants so we can complete the renovations. Also thank you to our member for Shellharbour - Anna Watson who assisted us with a grant of \$48000

Our Club has held a number of fund raising ventures over the season including BBQ's at Bunning's & Masters, Surf lifesaving Appeals Day, Shellharbour City's Australia Day Breakfast by the Lake, Warilla Hotel for Joker Poker, Halloween Night and raffles on the beach, again thanks to our the many members who have supported these events.

We have formed a clothing committee that has been working hard getting samples and designs ready for the start on the 2016/17 season. The results will be a standout.

On Friday 31st July our club started celebrating our 55th anniversary with a great and meet night attracting past & present members to the Surf Club to look over memorabilia and catch up on many stories that flowed & flowed. What a great night.

On Saturday 1st August at the Warilla Bowls Club a formal black tie night was held to celebrate our 55th Anniversary (yes it was a Black Tie night). In attendance was around 120 past and present members and their guest. Some people say one of the highlights was the Brazilian Dancers. But the hit of the night was the "all-male" review dancers - yes dancers. I have been told they were asked to appear on Australia's Got Talent.

A special thanks to Neisha and her willing band of helpers for organizing the weekend, and in addition to Neisha trying to teach men with 2 left feet to dance.

Early mail is our 60th anniversary will be held on the week end of 4th-5th October 2019.

The Warilla Oldies as always seeking new members. The Oldies is suited to the more senior members enjoying social evenings and some fundraising for the Club.

Our club played host to two major sporting events in the Branch. The Sydney Water Series (we hosted round 1). Also the South Coast Boat Series (round 4) was held at Warilla Beach. It was great to see so many of our club members assisting with these events. The club is appreciative of all members who assist the club in any way a member can.

The club has applied for grants and was successful in being able to attain two new IRB's and two new IRB motors including stainless steel four blade props, propeller guards and surf strengthening kits. These acquisitions will enhance our surf rescue and call out capability.

It was great to see our IRB team and lifesaving members provide water safety each week at our own club activities as well as a round of the Sydney Water Premiership, South Coast Branch Championships, ASRL Open Championships as well as our annual ocean swim. Job well done team.

The club BBQ / catering team and member helpers have put on some tantalising eats during the season which have been enjoyed by all. The hard work of these members has raised significant funds for the club. Richard Hayman has again gone above and beyond behind the scenes, purchasing and delivering stock to ensure there was enough in place to service our needs.

The Shellharbour Nippers, ably led by Dene Boyton and his Junior Activities Committee, are steadily growing stronger with their numbers remaining high as evidenced by numerous Surf Rescue Certificate awards being gained this season. Nipper surf education remains a focal point with 272 surf education awards achieved in season 2015 / 2016. Another season has drawn to a close, and it is time for a well earned rest for those who have volunteered their time throughout the season, and it was a hectic season with plenty of hours accrued with only 7 patrols operating. It is also time to reflect on the season and look forward to both the executive and general members taking up the challenges for the new coming season.

At present we have too few people putting their hand up to take on the various positions within the club which are integral to running a successful club. For those people that did take on positions - a big thank you for a job well done. Thanks must also go to the executive for handling their responsibilities in the utmost professional manner.

In turns of success achieved throughout the season, we carried out a total of 39 Rescues, using the following: - 13 x no gear, 18 x rescue tube, 2 x rescue board, 6 x IRB. Our trainers also trained members for 14 Surf Bronze, 14 Surf Rescue Certificate, 6 ARTC, and 3 Spinal management awards, this number was a little down on previous years, but still very note worthy. Thanks to all involved.

The Jet Rescue service - Surf Rescue 50 had a busy 2015/2016 season completing just over 300 hours of operations. This season there was a reduction in emergency callouts compared to last season, however Surf Rescue 50 was still proactive in carrying out surveillance patrols.

Surf Rescue 50 was also able to assist at a number of aquatic events this season.

Whilst on patrol, Surf Rescue 50 also checked rock ledge life rings in locations between Bass Point, Shellharbour and Seven Mile Beach, Gerroa. A total of forty-two preventative actions were carried out, with two shark alarms and one search.

The boat participated in a number of events, which included the Captain Christy Ocean Swim, Shellharbour Ocean Swim and the Kiama Raft Race. Surf Rescue 50 also hosted a number of rookie camps throughout the year giving young lifesavers the opportunity to experience a Jet Rescue Boat and expand their lifesaving knowledge.

Surf Rescue 50 responded to four emergency callouts across the season. This number down compared to the last couple of seasons, however this has been accredited to favourable sea conditions throughout the season and Kiama Council Lifeguards utilising a Rescue Water Craft weekdays.

To Sean Walter who has run the Kingfishers for the past 2 years - huge thanks for a wonderful job. I know you have passed the baton onto Lachlan Payne, and have seen the enthusiasm already he and his committee are working towards the new season.

In terms of the club itself - we have recently installed a disabled lift with the support of the State Government and Kiama Council - this will now provide access for the disabled to our function area. We are presently reviewing some projects for the new season, which will enhance the clubs future outlook.

To Patrick Sutton and family - words cannot express the loss to our club and the wider community with Carolyn's passing.

I am proud to report, that the dedication and hard work of my volunteer lifesavers has paid off, and we can again boast that no lives were lost during patrol hours on our beach for another season.

The start of the 2015/2016 season saw what would be the toughest start to a season in recent memory. In May 2015 the club saw the start of the final stage of our club renovations, the replacement of the club's balcony. The financial statements cover SOUTH COAST BRANCH (NSW) SURF LIFE SAVING AUSTRALIA INC as an individual entity. SOUTH COAST BRANCH (NSW) SURF LIFE SAVING AUSTRALIA INC is a not for profit Association incorporated in New South Wales under the Associations Incorporation Act 2009 ('the Act').

The functional and presentation currency of SOUTH COAST BRANCH (NSW) SURF LIFE SAVING AUSTRALIA INC is Australian dollars.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

In the opinion of the Committee of Management, the Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial report who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows, AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors and AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures.

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

Depreciation

The depreciation method and useful life used for items of property, plant and equipment (excluding freehold land) reflects the pattern in which their future economic benefits are expected to be consumed by the association. Depreciation commences from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements. The depreciation method and useful life of assets is reviewed annually to ensure they are still appropriate.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Sale of goods

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over the goods.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method.

If the outcome cannot be reliably estimated then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

Revenue from training services is generally recognised once the training has been delivered.


